Gift of £3k for cancer charity

A FOUNDATION raising funds for research into paediatric brain tumours has awarded a children's cancer charity £3,000.

The Ollie Young Foundation (OYF), which hit its £100,000 target last month, awarded CLIC Sargent the money to refurbish one of the family bathrooms at CLIC Court in Oxford, one of its self-catering residences for families.

OYF was set up in memory of Ollie Young, of Woosehill, who died the day before his sixth birthday from a brain tumour.

As well as funding research into paediatric brain tumours, the foundation also gives an annual grant to CLIC Sargent and Helen & Douglas House, which both supported Ollie and his family.
