In memory of Ollie

A FOUNDATION in memory of a schoolboy has donated £4,000 to a charity which supported his family.

Sarah and Simon Young, from Woosehill, launched the Ollie Young Foundation (OYF) in memory of their son, who died in February 2012 just one day before his sixth birthday.

Mr Young and Ollie's older brother Alfie visited Helen & Douglas House Hospice in Oxford to present a cheque for £4,000 to Trish MacIntyre, the charity's legacies and in memoriam fundraiser, along with Angela Wilkinson and Wendy Aubrey, two members of the care team who looked after Ollie during his stay.

The money helped fund a Magic

Mirror system which will be a key feature in Helen House's sensory room.

The Magic Mirror is an interactive gesture-controlled system that can be activated by any part of the body with the slightest of movements, producing different audio visual responses.

Mr Young said: "The Ollie Young Foundation has already purchased a multi-directional hoist for the wet room here, where Ollie spent many fun-filled hours. To be able to contribute this state-of-the-art system to the new-look Helen House means so much to us and I thank again all the wonderful fundraisers who have enabled us to do this in Ollie's memory."
